

read and take notes and listen in class

watch crash course | study for tests.

Read along with the class throughout the year

Take notes on how they want you to write your free responses.

You can do the large amount of reading each night figure out a schedule so that you don't attention and read the book

read the whole textbooks READ, Know Dates, specific events

and get a practice workbook a use it the whole year.

read every single night and take notes

\* Read the textbook, NOT all at once (in one sitting) but a little of each chapter, take a break and then resume. Take good notes too.

1. Reading the book like told is especially important
2. Take notes, even if you don't think you should, do it
3. Try to watch online videos to help solidify (?) important information at the end of each period if possible.

consistently take notes & study the capped (& other) section and pay attention to in-class

really understand the reading and try to review what you've learned periodically

definitely read lots of the notes/book, exams/LEAs/LEOs, and pay attention to help

Stay caught up and use study resources (Quizlet, crash course, etc)
